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SAFEGUARDING IN SPORT TRAINING

Safeguarding in Sport (formerly recognised as Child Protection Training) exists to help sport organisations put safeguards in place to keep children and young people safe. SportsScotland works with sport organisations to help put in place appropriate safeguards to protect children and young people under the age of 18 years who play sport.

Sport Scotland advocate that coaches, organisers and club officials who undertake duties with participants under the age of 18 years, receive safeguarding training, with many national sporting bodies require such training before coaching accreditation can be achieved.

The acknowledged training courses is Sports Coach UK, Safeguarding and Protecting Children which must be provided by a SportsScotland accredited tutor. The course is three hours duration and achieves the goal of

- Identifying and recognising good coaching practice, and the implications of safeguarding in coaching.
- Recognising and responding to the signs and symptoms of child abuse and poor practice.
- Taking appropriate action, if concerns about a child arise.

SPORT INVERCLYDE TRAINING FOR CLUBS/ORGANISATIONS

- Sport Inverclyde have registered with SportsScotland as a provider of 'Safeguarding in Sport' training and Children 1st provider of 'Safe Hands' training to enable clubs and organisations to gain the appropriate training when working with young people in sport.
